

## CHILDREN WITH LIFE THREATENING CONDITIONS PROCEDURE

### 1302.42 Child health status and care.

(a) *Source of health care.* (1) A program, within 30 calendar days after the child first attends the program or, for the home-based program option, receives a home visit, must consult with parents to determine whether each child has ongoing sources of continuous, accessible health care – provided by a health care professional that maintains the child’s ongoing health record and is not primarily a source of emergency or urgent care – and health insurance coverage.

### Purpose

To ensure a safe learning environment, prior to attendance at school, each child with a life threatening health condition shall present a Classroom Accommodation Plan, which addresses the condition to the school staff. The Classroom Accommodation Plan is to be completed by the child’s Primary Health Care Provider.

A life-threatening health condition is a health condition that will put the child in danger of death during the school day if a medication or treatment plan is not in place. Following the submission of a completed Classroom Accommodation Plan and necessary medication and/or equipment a plan will be developed in collaboration with the parent/guardian, classroom staff, and Classroom Accommodation Plan documentation.

Examples of Life-Threatening Conditions:

- Severe bee sting or food allergies
- Severe asthma, seizures, or heart problems
- Diabetes
