



Program Structure, Facilities and Equipment

OESD 114 implements more than one program option: center-based, home-based and family child care. These program options were chosen to meet the needs of children and families based on the community assessment and deliver a full rand of services that meet Head Start Performance Standards.

Licensing and square footage requirements	Olympic College and Discovery Alternative High School must be licensed by the state and must follow most stringent provisions. Center-based program must have at least 35 square feet of useable indoor space per child and 75 square feet of useable outdoor play space per child. Child Development Specialist		An educarer (coach or child development specialist) conducts regular visits of each family child care home, some of which are unannounced, not less than once every two weeks. The educarer supports compliance of contract requirements, facilitates communication and provides training and technical assistance.
