



## **Exposure Notice – Cytomegalovirus (CMV)**

Dear Family,

Your child may have been exposed to cytomegalovirus (CMV) while at the EHS/Head Start/ECEAP center. Cytomegalovirus(CMV) is a viral infection common in children.

## What are the symptoms of CMV?

Generally, no symptoms in young children. Some people may experience fever, sore throat, tiredness, and swollen glands.

**How is it spread?** Person-to-person contact with blood, saliva, urine and other secretions from infected people or mother to infant before, during, and after birth.

When do symptoms start? Incubation unknown.

If you are pregnant, discuss CMV with your health care provider.

**Need to keep child home?** No, as long as s/he does not have any other symptoms that would require exclusion such as fever.

If your child presents with these symptoms, please notify you EHS/Head Start/ECEAP classroom. Please notify health careprovider with any concerns.
