



Exposure Notice - Fifth Disease (Erythema Infectiosum)

Dear Family:

Your child may have been exposed to Fifth Disease at the EHS/Head Start/ECEAP center, a mild rash illness caused by a virus. It usually occurs in late winter or early spring, sometimes in clusters or outbreaks.

What are the symptoms? Fever, headache, fatigue, and chills. About 4-14 days later the appearance of a red rash on the face that looks like slapped cheeks will appear. Sometimes the rash will appear on arms and legs. The rash may fade then reappear.

How is it spread? Through direct contact with droplets from an infected person who is talking, coughing or sneezing. By the time the rash appears the person is no longer contagious.

When do symptoms start? 4-21 days after exposure.

Need to keep child home? No, unless unable to participate in activities.
