

6. Preview report to make sure it is the correct one, then print.

She needed to know that there are 26 letters, and that a letter name is used for a uppercase and a lowercase shape. To complete her second goal of counting to 20 (20a) Child needed to be able to make a connection between how many there are and the language we use to count, know the number words and start to recognizing small groups of items.
