## OLYMPIC ESD 114 BOARD POLICY STUDENT CONDUCT

## **POLICY 3240**

The Olympic ESD 114 (OESD) Board of Directors (Board) acknowledges that conduct and behavior is closely associated with learning. An effective instructional program requires a wholesome and orderly learning environment. The Board requires each student to adhere to the rules of conduct and to submit to corrective action taken as a result of conduct violations. The rules of conduct are applicable during the day as well as during any program activity conducted on or off site. Special rules may also be applicable while riding in agency and district vehicles

If possible, student corrective action will be the responsibility of the students' resident district and administered in accordance with that district's student discipline policies and procedures. When such deference is not possible, the rules described below shall apply and corrective action will be administered in accordance with Chapter 392-400 WAC Student Discipline.

## Students are expected to:

- 1. Conform to reasonable standards of socially acceptable behavior;
- 2. Respect the rights, person and property of others;
- 3. Preserve the degree of order necessary for a positive climate for learning;
- 4. Comply with OESD rules and regulations; and
- 5. Comply with school district rules and regulations when on school district property; and
- 6. Submit to the authority of staff and respond accordingly.

The Superintendent/designee shall develop written rules of conduct which will carry out the intent of the Board.
